They showed me around the different classrooms and spaces in the school and about the various projects. They discussed with me about lunchtimes and playtimes and how they had a peaceful protest about the football. They felt nurtured and cared for and knew exactly who they could talk to and where to go if they felt they needed to talk to someone. They were very connected to school life and talked to me about the think books and the work you do around relationships, difference and the young people and projects you support abroad. They talked about assemblies and how useful these are and there was genuine pride in belonging to your school. They were so confident and chatty and are great ambassadors for your school. They talked about the reward schemes and merits. In their classes they showed me all the children were in the green zone for behaviour. They genuinely seemed to have a caring nature to each other and to all the pupils in the school right down to reception. They talked about the sharing of lunchtime space with younger pupils and how they felt this was really good. They were very proud to talk about the upcoming school performance the Wizard of Oz and how they had made the posters etc. They talked about the road safety campaign and how they felt safe at play times. They talked about work around inspirational people and role models.

It was genuinely nice to have the tour of your school and to see how evident it is in every part of the school how respect and values are embedded. They also talked about moving on to secondary school and they all seemed very secure about the change, a credit to the work that has been done.
